DC Pope Visit 2015 Student Resources

Pope Francis is coming to DC! He will be at several places from September 22-24, 2015. Below is a brief biography of the Pope and description of key events. If you are interested or need more information about this important visit, come to the Harvard Campus Library in Room 116 or go to the resources listed at the end of the document.

Who: Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on December 17, 1936, Jorge Mario Bergoglio became Pope Francis on March 13, 2013, when he was named the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church. He is the first Pope from the Americas. In December 2013, Pope Francis was also named Person of the Year by *Time* magazine. He has spoken out against poverty, against environmental destruction, and against war. [Source: biography.com]

What: Because of the Pope's visit, there will not be any classes on September 23, 2015. This is Pope Francis' first visit to the US. You can see the Pope at different places around DC and watch him on the Internet.
